

Church Membership



It's great that you're attending Blockhouse Bay Community Church and are now considering Church Membership. This brochure provides answers to the most commonly asked questions - if you have any others, please talk to the Pastors or the Elders.

What is Church Membership?

Church Membership is a formal way of expressing your commitment to the BBCC family and to the calling, culture, and core values of the church.

Do I have to become a Member?

No. We encourage this step of commitment but it's not compulsory, and we don't put any pressure on people to become members.

Can I be involved in ministry if I'm not a Member?

Yes. The only ministries that are restricted to members are the key Leadership roles of Elders and Ministry & Management Team leaders, however we do expect everyone involved in teaching ministries to affirm our Statement of Faith.

Am I going to be asked to do a lot more after I become a Member?

No. Our church culture encourages everyone to be actively involved in ministry and committed to the church regardless of their membership status.

Is Church Membership mentioned in the Bible?

Not directly, but the principle of commitment to God's people is. Church Membership is simply a formal expression of your commitment to this local body of Christians.

Can I transfer my Membership from another church?

No. Every church has its own way of dealing with church membership and so we ask everyone to go through the application procedure explained in this brochure.

Is there a minimum age for Membership?

Yes, you must be at least 16 years old.

Is there a Statement of Faith I need to affirm?

Yes. Blockhouse Bay Community Church is a member of the Alliance Churches of New Zealand and we affirm their statement of faith listed in this brochure. If you have any questions about our beliefs, please talk to the Pastors or the Elders.

What are the benefits of a becoming a Member?

- Psalm 133 explains that unity amongst God's people brings a blessing and church membership is a way of expressing unity in a local church.
- Only Members are eligible to vote on important issues at Church business meetings and elect our Elders.
- Only Members can serve as Elders and Ministry & Management Team leaders.

If I want to become a Member, what do I do?

Read this brochure, fill out the attached application form, and hand it to either the Pastors or one of the Elders.

What happens after I hand in my application form?

The Pastors & Elders will arrange to meet with you and discuss your application. They will ask you to share your Christian testimony, including when you were baptised as a teenager or an adult, and give you an opportunity to ask any questions about Blockhouse Bay Community Church. After this meeting, and subject to a recommendation from the Elders, you are welcomed into Membership during the next convenient Sunday morning service.

Some final thoughts...

When you were born again, you automatically became a part of God's universal family, but you also need to become a member of a local expression of God's family.

Why is it important to join a local church family? Because it proves you are committed to your spiritual brothers and sisters in reality, not just in theory. God wants you to love real people, not ideal people. You can spend a lifetime searching for the perfect church, but you will never find it. You are called to love imperfect sinners, just as God does

STATEMENT OF FAITH

Blockhouse Bay Community Church is a member of the Alliance Churches of New Zealand and affirms the following beliefs:

A. There is one God,¹ Creator of all things,² who is infinitely perfect,³ and existing eternally in three Persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.⁴

B. Jesus Christ is true God and true man.⁵ He was conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary.⁶ He died upon the cross, the Righteous for the unrighteous, as a substitutionary sacrifice,⁷ and all who believe in Him are justified on the ground of His shed blood.⁸ He arose from the dead according to the Scriptures.⁹ He is now at the right hand of the Majesty on high¹⁰ as our great High Priest.¹¹ He will come again to establish His Kingdom of righteousness and peace.¹²

C. The Holy Spirit is a divine person, sent to indwell, guide, teach, and empower the believer for godly living and service, to bring glory to the Lord Jesus Christ, and to convict the world of sin, of righteousness and of judgment.¹³

D. The Old and New Testaments, inerrant as originally given, whose words were inspired by God, are a complete revelation of His will for the salvation of all people. They constitute the divine and only rule of Christian faith and practice.¹⁴

E. People were originally created in the image and likeness of God; they fell through disobedience, incurring thereby both physical and spiritual death.¹⁵ Subsequently all people are born with a sinful nature, are separated from the life of God, and can be saved only through faith in the atoning work of the Lord Jesus Christ on the cross.¹⁶ The destiny of the unrepentant and unbelieving is everlasting separation from God in conscious torment (Hell); but that of the believer is everlasting joy and blessing in the presence of the Lord (Heaven).¹⁷

F. Salvation has been provided only through Jesus Christ for all people.¹⁸ Those who repent and believe in Him are justified freely by His grace, are born again of the Holy Spirit, receive the gift of eternal life, and become the children of God.¹⁹

G. It is the will of God that each believer should be filled with the Holy Spirit and be sanctified thoroughly, thereby being separated from the power of sin and conformity to the world, and being fully dedicated to the will of God, receiving power for holy living and sacrificial and effective service toward the completion of Christ's commission.²⁰ This is both a distinct encounter and a progressive experience in the life of the believer subsequent to conversion.²¹

H. Provision is made in the redemptive work of the Lord Jesus Christ for the healing of the mortal body.²² Prayer for the sick and anointing with oil as taught in the Scriptures are privileges for the Church in this present age.²³

I. The universal Church consists of all those who believe in the Lord Jesus Christ, are redeemed through His blood, and are born again of the Holy Spirit. Christ is the Head of the Body, the Church. He has commissioned the Church to go to all nations as a witness of the Gospel.²⁴

The local church is a body of believers in Christ who are joined together for the worship of God, which includes being built up through the Word of God, prayer, fellowship, the observance of Baptism and the Lord's Supper, and the witness of the Gospel locally and globally.²⁵

J. There shall be a bodily resurrection of all people.²⁶ For believers a resurrection to life;²⁷ for unbelievers a resurrection to judgement.²⁸

K. The second coming of the Lord Jesus Christ is imminent, and will be personal and visible.²⁹ As the believer's blessed hope, this vital truth is an incentive to holy living and faithful service toward the completion of Christ's commission.³⁰
